Bedrooms

The majority of rooms are single rooms. There are a limited number of twin, triple and dormitory rooms available. Every room has a bed, wardrobe, chest of drawers and chair. **Please note:** towels and hair dryers are not provided.

Bathrooms

Shared showers and toilet facilities, which are situated at strategic points throughout the accommodation.

Housekeeping

Bedrooms and bathrooms are cleaned regularly. Fresh bed linen is provided weekly.

Meals

Full board (breakfast, lunch and dinner are served at the school and a packed lunch is provided on study tours). As well as a variety of global cuisines, students will experience traditional British meals such as roast dinners and fish and chips.

Laundry

Free laundry service for machine washable clothes once a week. Bell can not take responsibility for any items lost or damaged during the laundry process.

Pocket Money

£100 per week (recommendation).

Electricity

220-240V, 50Hz AC.
UK-type 3-pin plugs are used.

Curfew

Lights are switched off between 22:30 and 23:00. Students are not allowed outside the school site without supervision.

- ✓ All onsite staff are police checked



Local Area Information

Travelling by car from M25

1. Exit the M25 at Junction 15 towards Reading and Wokingham.
2. Exit the M4 at Junction 10 Junction 10 Junction 10, then join the A329(M) (signposted Wokingham, Bracknell).
3. At the Doncastle roundabout take the 1st exit onto Berkshire Way - A329 (signposted Bracknell, Ascot).
4. At the Twin Bridges roundabout take the 3rd exit onto Mill Lane - A3095 (signposted Southern Industrial Area, Sandhurst). There are often traffic lights working on this roundabout.
5. After a mile, you will reach a roundabout take the 2nd exit onto Mill Lane - A3095 (signposted Sandhurst).
6. After half a mile, at another roundabout take the 3rd exit onto Crowthorne Road - A3095 (signposted Crowthorne).

7. After another mile, you will come to another roundabout take the 2nd exit onto Foresters Way - A3095 signposted Crowthorne, Sandhurst).

8. After 1/3 of a miles at the roundabout take the 3rd exit onto Bracknell Road - B3348 (signposted Crowthorne).

9. After a mile you will come to a small roundabout. Continue straight over it into Crowthorne (2nd exit), remaining on the B3348.

10. Shortly afterwards (300 metres), you will come to a mini-roundabout. Turn half-right onto Dukes Ride.

11. Continue down Dukes Ride, continue straight over the traffic lights, passing the "Waterloo Hotel" on your left.

12. Around 500 metres after this you will see, signed to the left, the entrance to Wellington College.

From Crowthorne station

As you leave the station, turn From Crowthorne station, right and walk up Dukes Ride, past the shops of lower Crowthorne.

After about 750 metres, you will see the main entrance to the School on your right. Proceed along 'The Kilometre' and you will see the main school buildings on your right. Trains leave from London Paddington to Reading, change at Reading for Crowthorne
